Attendees:

- The Management of Major Emergencies course is designed for personnel who have emergency response management duties or are members of an emergency response team within an Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) at a plant, facility or other location. Typically, the EOC manages emergencies in the field and may report to a Corporate Emergency Operations Centre (CEOC) at an organizations headquarters. facility, plant or other location Courses can be conducted for the Private Sector, all levels of Government (Federal/Provincial/State and Local) and industries such as Oil and Gas, Aviation, Marine, Mining, Pulp and Paper and Utilities etc.

Course Objectives

- To provide a concise understanding of the roles, responsibilities, and procedures to be followed during emergencies.
- To introduce the concepts of command and control (emergency management) as applied from an EOC.
- To demonstrate the effectiveness of an information system, suitable for collecting and displaying critical information during an emergency:
- To provide initial training for personnel seeking formal competency assessment as an Emergency Manager.
- To provide non-operational support staff with an overview of how emergencies are managed.
- To provide each attendee with the confidence to demonstrate, through simulation, his or her ability to manage emergencies.
